



East Side Shuttle:

Glacier Park, Inc. offers shuttle service to many locations along the East side of Glacier National Park. Shuttles are white, eight passenger vans and seating is on a space-available basis. This East Side Shuttle begins operation on June 6 with its last run on September 25, 2008.

To determine your shuttle departure time and location, refer to the grid below and start on the left with the tan column showing where you are originating from. Then, move right along the row to the column that displays your destination (destinations can be found in the top dark tan row). The box where this column and row intersect will be your departure time and total price per person for this one-way shuttle. Arrival times are not listed. **Children under 12 are half price.**

Scenic Interpretive Red Bus Tours in and around Glacier National Park 2008



Red Bus Tour Experience:

The historic (1936 -1939) Red Buses are both a symbol of Glacier National Park and a reminder of a time when adventurous travel was done with style and grace. Our vintage touring coach drivers are called "Jammers" by the locals; a name which carries over from the days when the buses had standard transmissions and the drivers could be heard "jamming" the gears as they drove up and down the rugged mountain highway.

On each tour, adventure awaits as a Jammer picks you up at your pre-selected origin and welcomes you onboard the same way Jammers have done for over 90 years with the "roll call". You will also have the opportunity to have a commemorative photo of you taken by our professional photographers, which will be available for your viewing after the tour. Once on board, you will enjoy the bus' unique canvas top, which rolls back allowing all 17 passengers a commanding view of the spectacular scenery within Glacier National Park.

The Jammers are there throughout the tour to ensure your safety, answer any questions and to provide an informative and entertaining commentary. The commentary includes stories of Glacier's vast history and culture including its geologic, biologic and Native American past. The Jammer's sharp eyes are also trained to point out Glacier's wildlife treasures, including Grizzly and black bears, mountain goats and big horn sheep. At the conclusion of your tour, the Jammer will deliver you safely back to where your adventure began.

What to Bring on Your Tour:

Because of the unique road system in Glacier National Park, most of our tours exit and re-enter the park at least once during the day. It is very important to remember to bring your park pass with you on tour. Furthermore, if your tour crosses the Canadian Border, be sure to bring your passport. In addition, because of our variable weather, you may wish to bring a jacket, hat, sunscreen and water. Most importantly, bring a camera to help capture all of the amazing scenery you will encounter on your tour.

Canadian Travel:

Beginning January 31, 2008, U.S. citizens 19 years and older who enter the U.S. at land ports of entry from within Canada will need to present a government issued photo ID, such as a driver's license as proof of identity, along with proof of citizenship, such as a birth certificate or naturalization certificate, or a passport. Children age 18 and under will be able to enter with proof of citizenship (birth certificate, naturalization certificate or a passport).

Citizens of countries other than the United States and Canada must have a passport and visa (if required). The shuttle heading southbound from Prince of Wales Hotel is for northbound return guests only. For information about southbound options from Waterton or any other Canadian travel questions, please call Glacier Park, Inc. at (406) 892-2525.

Cancellation Policy:

Cancellations made within 3 days (72 hours) of tour departure will result in a full forfeit of the deposit. Deposits are fully refundable for 30 days following the date the tour reservation was made. From 31 days after the reservation was made to 3 days prior to tour departure, the deposit will be refunded less a \$15.00 administrative fee per tour. For reservations made within 30 days prior to tour departure, the above policy applies with no 30-day grace period.

Please Note:

- Prices for all tours (except where noted) are for transportation only. All rates are quoted in U.S. Dollars and do not include driver gratuity. Refunds may be given for altered and/or modified routes due to weather, construction or other reasons deemed necessary by Glacier Park, Inc. Child prices are for children under 12 years of age.
- Tour routes and itineraries scheduled to go over the Going-to-the-Sun Road are dependent upon access to Logan Pass Visitor Center and other construction projects underway by the National Park Service. Construction delays may occur at any point along the tour and may cause tour timing and itinerary modification. Views of the Park while on a tour are weather dependent.
- Glacier National Park and Waterton Lakes National Park have separate entrance fees not included in tour pricing. If you are already inside the Park, please bring your Park entrance fee receipt along as most tours exit and re-enter the Park.
- Please be at the tour departure location a minimum of ten minutes prior to tour departure time.
- Tours do not depart from or return to the Apgar Transit Center.

75th Anniversary of Going-to-the-Sun Road:

The summer of 2008 marks the 75th Anniversary of the Going-to-the-Sun Road. This National Historic Landmark links West Glacier and St. Mary through Glacier National Park's most spectacular alpine scenery. The idea of a trans-mountain highway had been envisioned since the park's establishment in 1910, but was not officially begun until 1919.

Over the next 14 years, the arduous task of building a road through the rugged alpine terrain was accomplished through sheer will and determination. Ceremoniously, on July 15th, 1933, the completed road was opened to the public. Named the Going-to-the-Sun Road by George C. Ruhle (Chief Park Naturalist at the time), after a nearby mountain and local Blackfeet legend, the road still stands today as a legacy to all of those who dreamt of, and built, one of the most breath-taking roads in America.

We honor this achievement with our 75th Anniversary Crown of the Continent Tour, which takes passengers over this spectacular road departing from both the east and west sides of Glacier National Park.
